Please note the following clarifications / corrections to the 2026 Sporting Regulations for the CrowdStrike 24 Hours of Spa

1: Clarification concerning FCY – Addition to article 39.4 - FCY

Under certain circumstances, the Race Director, or in his absence, his deputy or the Clerk of the Course, may ask all cars to drive into the pit lane without overtaking. Any such car entering the pit lane under these circumstances may stop at its designated garage area. In this case the message “All cars must use the pit lane“ will be displayed on the official timing system and announced via the team radio.

Once the track between pit entry and pit exit is clear again, the message “All cars must use start/finish straight“ will be displayed on the official timing system and announced via the team radio.

2: Correction concerning article 15.6 - Time Penalties

Please note the following addendum for cases where a minimum pit stop is in operation, in case of a fuel sensor failure (article 502.13 b) :

“Should a minimum pit stop time be in force, the minimum pit stop time will be extended by the time of the penalty imposed”

3: Correction concerning the continuous driving time – Article 218.5.3

The maximum continuous driving time as mentioned in article 218.5.3 is amended to 3 x EDS. Each individual stint time will be rounded down to the nearest minute.

4: Clarification concerning battery-operated tools

We would remind teams that battery-operated tools, including wheel guns, are not authorised for use in the working lane at any time. Pneumatic tools (eg screwdrivers) may be used ONLY during the brake operations as described in article 223.4
